### *for Youth Leadership in China 2026's Youth Forum*

- **A Brief Overview of Your Project**

Is it an art project that expresses your concept of wellness for future generations? Or a scientific model that could lead us to rethink how we use energy? Please use a few sentences to describe the gist of your project and what impact you are hoping to make.

- **How Your Project Relates to the Forum Theme**

Please explain why your project aligns with the theme of the Youth Forum: "One World, Our Future." The theme is broad so you can be creative to make the connection!

- **How Did You Implement/Plan to Implement Your Project**

Did you implement your project, or is it still in conceptualization? Did you work by yourself or with a team? Do you think working with someone from another country will enrich your project? Please describe how you made/plan to make the project happen. If it's done already, be prepared to talk about your working methods!
